- Increase understanding and visibility of specific nature of urban crises
- Ensure the availability of specialist capacity and tools to respond to urban crises more effectively
- Inform recruitment and professional development


UCF - What?

 - Sector-specific e.g. NiE, WiE and CPiE
 - Applicable to all humanitarians e.g. the CHCF
- Based on structure of Core Humanitarian Competency Framework
- Designed to be read in conjunction with other CFs

THE MODEL OF THE UCF




What is included:
