# TWO-FOLD EARLY RECOVERY APPROACH

- 1. Mainstream early recovery into the activities of all sectors constituting the humanitarian system;**
- 2. Clarify the type of activities that the sector would focus on and that complements the other sectors.**

# EARLY RECOVERY SECTOR FOCUSES ON:

- **Disaster Risk Reduction**
- **Reintegration support for returning IDPs**
- **Conflict and emergencies**
- **Host community support**
- **Urban livelihoods**

## **EHRP+ STRATEGIC OBJECTIVE:**

---

- × Enhance community resilience using disaster risk reduction and early recovery approaches to reduce high levels of chronic vulnerability and to diminish the impact of disasters**



# 15 EARLY RECOVERY PROJECTS

---

- × **Just under US\$25 million**
- × **3 times more than in 2010**
- × **the 3 year EHRP, as opposed to the 12 month CAPs. Its intention is specifically to put the focus on longer term objectives of humanitarian support, which provides a wide window for ER.**

## CROSS CUTTING ISSUES WELL INTEGRATED

---

- ✘ **The Early Recovery sector also joined forces with OCHA, Help Age International, Gen Cap Working Group, and the Protection Sector (led by UNHCR) to develop a minimum standards document on cross-cutting issues.**
- ✘ **This will strengthen the sustainability of humanitarian interventions across the emergency response plan.**

- ✘ **Well supported consultative session, which catalysed a strong discussion on rain dependency, market access, livelihoods, and many other issues related to early recovery**
